## The Dispensation of Conscience

The antediluvian righteous and unrighteous

- **I.** The righteous—Enoch, "initiated" (Gen. 5:21-24).
  - 1. He believed that there was a God and searched for Him (Heb. 11:6; *cf.* Rom. 3:11).
  - 2. He was a prophet, rewarded with revelation (Heb. 11:6; Jude 14).
  - 3. He had a witness regarding his revelation of judgment (Heb. 11:5; Gen. 5:21; Jude 14-15).
  - 4. Methuselah, "man of the dart", "having died it comes".
  - 5. He did not "see" the process of death (Heb. 11:5).
  - 6. Noah, "rest" walked with God (Gen. 6:9).

## **II.** The unrighteous—most.

- 1. After Genesis 5:5, 'Adam' means "mankind" (Gen. 6:1-7).
  - 1) Daughters born to "them", mankind, not a new concept.
  - 2) Includes all mankind, not a specific line.
- 2. The "sons of God" were fallen angels (2 Pet. 2:46; Jude 6-7; *cf.* Mt. 22:28, 30).
  - 1) No human is called a son of God in the Old Testament (*cf.* Is. 43:6; Hosea 1:10; Lu. 3:38).
  - 2) Spirit beings, including Satan are called sons of God (Job 1:6; 2:1; 38:7; Ps. 89:6, *cf.* Eph. 3:15; Is. 66:1).
- 3. The offspring of these sons of God and the daughters of men are the reason for the impending universal judgment (Gen. 6:1-7).
  - 1) The progeny were giants—"fallen ones".
  - 2) The had changed procreation (Gen. 6:12).
  - 3) The progeny, prized by mankind, were an insult to creation and the Creator (Gen. 6:5; .
- 4. The animal kingdom was polluted as well (Gen. 7:21-23).
- 5. Only Noah's line was pure genetically (Gen. 6:9).
