- **I.** The test during the Dispensation of Human Government.
 - 1. For all of mankind.
 - 2. Could humans govern themselves and follow a few very basic rules to please God?
 - 1) Multiply—procreate.
 - 2) Spread out over the land—Failed.
 - 3) Become omnivores.
 - 4) Do not drink the blood of animals.
 - 5) Put murderers to death—Failed.
- II. New Testament record of their failure (Rom. 1:21-23).
 - 1. Apparently the eight who got off the ship had minimal influence over their progeny.
 - 2. Mankind was not thankful toward God.
 - 3. They had no insight into who God is.
 - 4. Their pondering thoughts changed the immortal God to immortal images: gods.
 - 5. They were spiritual morons.

III. Noah.

- 1. Had 'issues" with Ham (Gen. 9:20-26).
- 2. Fermentation new with climatic changes?
- 3. Noah cursed Ham's son.
- 4. Noah lived 350 years after the Flood and is never heard from; he apparently did not stand up to unrighteousness.
- 5. Noah's three sons are the progenitors of vast areas.
 - 1) Japhet—the European nations.
 - 2) Ham—African nations.
 - 3) Shem—Eastern nations.
 - 4) Noah—the Americas?
- IV. Unrighteousness is incentivized by society (Gen. 10).
 - 1. There is no mention of an act of faith during this period in Hebrews the 11 chapter.
 - 2. Nimrod "the rebel" (Gen. 10:8-11).
 - 3. Mankiller against the LORD.
 - 4. King, against the cursed line.
 - 5. Built cities, failed to spread out over the land.
 - 6. Instigates building the Tower.
 - 7. Righteousness in the Shem line—Peleg (Gen. 10:25).
