The Dispensation of Law

the Object of Faith for Salvation

- **I.** The object of faith for salvation changes during different Dispensations.
 - 1. Before Law, Abraham till Exodus 19, they had to believe the promise to Abraham that his seed would inherit the Promised Land (Gen. 15:4-7, Rom. 4:1-4; Ex. 19:5).
 - 2. Christians' object of faith is the Gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-4; Rom. 1:16; 4:24).
 - 3. Salvation throughout all Dispensations is by grace, through faith (Rom. 4:4, 9, Eph. 2:8), which was also true during Law (Rom. 4:5; 11:6).
- **II.** What was the object of faith for salvation during the Dispensation of Law?
 - 1. After the Glory left Israel (Ez. 10) they had to believe that the Glory would return to Israel (Is. 25:9; 41:31; Lu. 2:25).
 - 2. When the Glory was dwelling among Israel, nonbelievers did not believe that Jehovah dwelt in the Temple (Ez. 8:6-11).
 - 3. Therefore, saints during the first part of Law while the Glory was present in the Tabernacle/Temple, had to believe that Jehovah dwelt between the Cherubs, above the Ark in the Holy of Holies (Ex. 25:22; Lev. 16:14).
- **III.** Keeping The Law was a means for physical blessing, not spiritual salvation.
 - 1. Conditional love from God (Deut. 7:12-13).
 - 2. Provisions for Gentiles to proselyte to The Law (Ex. 12:48-49; Lev. 16:29; 19:33-34; Num. 15:15).
 - 3. Provisions for illegitimate offspring (Duet. 23:2).
 - 4. Restrictions for two nations (Lev. 23:3).
 - 5. No stranger could come near the utensil for the Tabernacle (Num. 1:51; 3:10, 38; 18:7).
