

The Seven Sayings on the Cross, #1

I. Jesus's betrayal and arrest.

1. Brought before Caiaphas and the Sanhedrin (Mt. 26:57-68; Mk. 15:55-65; Lu. 63-71; Jn. 18:19-24).
2. Sanhedrin takes Him to Pilate (Mt. 27:1-2; 11-14; Mk. 15:1-5; Lu. 23:1-5; Jn. 18:28-38).
3. Pilate sends Jesus to Herod (Lu. 23:6-12; Jn. 19:4).
4. Jesus is brought back before Pilate, who releases Barabbas and delivers Jesus to be crucified (Mt. 27:15-26; Mk. 15: 6-15; Lu. 23:13-25; Jn. 18:39-39-40; 19:4-16).
5. Jesus is crowned with thrones, and mocked (Mt. 27:26-30; Mk. 15:15-20; Lu. 23:13-25; Jn. 18:39-40; 19:4-16).
6. Judas hangs himself (Mt. 27:3-10).
7. Jesus is led forth to be crucified, Simon takes Jesus' cross, Jesus talks to the women (Mt. 27:31-32; Mk. 15:20-23; Lu. 23:26-33; Jn. 19:16-17).
8. Jesus arrives at Golgotha (Mt. 27:33; Mk. 15:22; Lu. 23:33; Jn. 19:17).
9. Jesus is offered "doctored" drink (Mt. 27:34; Mk. 15:23).
10. Jesus is crucified between two thieves (Mt. 27:35-38).

II. Jesus first cry from the Cross (Lu. 23:34).

1. 9:00 am, Jewish time—three hours from 6:00am., (Mk. 15:25; 33-34).
2. Who is the "them"?
3. Those that cast lots.
4. Jesus' prayers always answered, and did not need to be uttered out loud (Jn. 11:41-42).
5. Jesus bore sins on the cross, not before (1 Pet. 2:24; 2 Cor. 5:21).
6. He bore the sins of all the world: all of mankind (Acts 4:27-28).
7. The "passion" leading up to His death did not pay for our sins, not suffering for our sins, till cross.
8. Jesus' prayer allowed for the soldiers to have no greater responsibility for Jesus' death than the rest of the world.
9. This is in contrast to Judas (Mt. 26:24; Mk. 14:21).
