## The Inner Man part 3

- **I.** At salvation the believer is given access to the mind of Christ (1 Cor. 2:16).
  - 1. This addition constitutes a new dynamic—a new heart.
  - 2. New ability to think righteous thoughts.
  - 3. New ability to rationally manage emotions.
  - 4. New ability to live in the present based on the future that God has planned for us—faith.
  - 5. New motivation.
- **II.** Although man esteems the exterior of others, God values the interior of the practicing Christian (1 Pet. 1:4).
  - 1. The "hidden man" in relationship to the heart.
  - 2. Meekness—objectivity of rational thought, not swayed by emotion: divine enabling.
  - 3. Quiet spirit—rational thought not disturbed by the soul (cf. 1 Pet. 2:25).
- III. The inner man contrasted to the outward man (2 Cor. 4:8-15).
  - 1. Paul suffering physically for the Lord and the Corinthians.
  - 2. The contrast of the outward man and inner man.

Affliction/tribulation	Glory
Momentary	Eternal
Seen—no faith	Not seen—faith
Temporal	Eternal
